As the Social Worker you will play a crucial role in providing culturally appropriate and holistic support to Aboriginal individuals and families. You will be responsible for providing complex case management services with the intention to make a real difference in the lives of Aboriginal people and contribute to the ongoing efforts of reconciliation and social justice.

Key Selection Criteria:

- Bachelor's or Master's degree in Social Work or a related field.
- AHPRA Registration OR Accredited Mental Health Social Worker with full Australian AASW registration (AMHSW).
- Proven experience in clinical case management or similar role.
- Experience in working in an Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Service (Desired).
- Medicare Provider Number or eligibility to register.
- Permanent work rights in Australia.
- Current National Police Check, DHS WWCC, and DHS Aged Care Screening.
- **COVID-19 and Flu Vaccinations not mandatory**, but highly encouraged.
- Strong assessment, counselling, and crisis intervention skills.
- High level understanding of social work concepts and practices.
- Deep understanding of the historical and contemporary issues faced by Aboriginal people and well-being issues within the community.
- Exceptional analytical skills to identify problems and develop solutions.
- Advanced Computer literacy including MS Office.
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills with ability to build relationships with patients, families, and healthcare professionals.
- Excellent organisational and time management skills with the ability to manage competing tasks and priorities.

Key Responsibilities:

- Conduct comprehensive and accurate assessments of clients' social, emotional, and cultural needs.
- Develop and implement culturally sensitive care plans to address clients' goals and aspirations.
- Undertake crisis intervention that includes multi service case management for referred clients.
- Liaise with and refer other professional service providers (both external providers and YHAC professionals) to ensure appropriate solutions are provided to clients.
- Collaborate with colleagues, community organisations, and government agencies to enhance service delivery and promote positive outcomes.
- Facilitate group therapy sessions and educational and support programs.
- Develop and implement community health promotions, projects and programs targeting relevant and identified social and emotional health issues.
- Maintain accurate client clinical records and statistical information on conducted activities.
- Complete monthly reporting for senior management and key funding bodies.
- Participate in organisational audits and reviews including accreditation and quality improvement and planning.
- Implement improvements identified in any audits or reviews conducted.
- Ensure the confidentiality and security of client information.
