As an Aboriginal Health Worker/Practitioner, you will be working closely with our multidisciplinary team to provide timely, culturally appropriate, and holistic primary health care to our clients.

If you have great communication skills, and a desire to empower individuals and communities **but do not hold the formal qualifications, we still encourage you to apply!** A willingness to obtain the listed qualifications upon employment would be required.

Working Arrangements:

- Permanent Full-Time Position with flexible hours 37.5 per week worked across 5 days.
- Hours of work may include some after-hours activities & travel.

- Aboriginal Health Practitioners must hold a current AHPRA Registration.
- Passionate about making a positive impact on the health and well-being of Aboriginal communities.
- Have a great attitude and strong work ethic.
- Acts with integrity and always shows respect to fellow staff and management.
- A team player who actively listens and is willing to help or support the YHAC team during difficult or busy times.
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills with ability to build relationships with patients, families, and healthcare professionals.
- Sound organisational and time management skills with the ability to manage competing tasks and priorities.
- Commitment to maintaining patient confidentiality and privacy.

- Proficiency using Microsoft Office programs, including Microsoft Word and Microsoft Excel.
- Current National Police Check, SA Working with Children Check, and SA Aged Care Screening.
- Covid-19 & Flu Vaccinations not required but highly encouraged.
- Current Unrestricted SA Drivers Licence.
